## L. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans

## **A. Research**

My scientific research to date has focused mainly on Law, Social Policy, Human Rights and Ageing. These constitute a novel and still developing field of academic expertise that, in light of the revolution in ageing and the struggle to shape new policies that address the social issues arising from it, has become a very dynamic and promising field of research.

Along my academic activity I have been known as an international academic expert in the field of Law, Social Policy and Ageing and have developed new models and modes of research in this field. There are already numerous international studies that have relied on my research findings. It should be noted that I edited the first (and only) international book regarding the theoretical conceptualization of elder law (Doron, 2008) which included chapters from the leading scholars in this field world wide. The international success of this book was the basis for publishing yet another key book in the field (Doron & Soden, 2012), which went beyond theories and into future developmental directions of the field of law and aging. This has led to the co-editing of yet another ground breaking book and the first of its kind on the topic of Law, Ethics and Dementia (with Foster and Herring; Hart: 2015).

From a research perspective, in an article I have written in 2006 (article no. 23) I have set the agenda for my future research, and pointed to three different novel research directions: 1) International elder law; 2) Municipal elder law; 3) Jurisprudential gerontology. Since my last promotion I have executed my plans and conducted, headed, and advanced the research in all of these three novel research fields. For example, in the field of international elder law, I have been a partner in developing a new discourse for the need to a new international convention for the rights of older persons, and I have published one of the leading articles in this field (in *The Gerontologist*, i.e. Doron & Apter, 2010); For example, in the field of municipal elder law, I have received several research grants from the Borchard Foundation (with Prof. Kim Dayton) to conduct and advance the research in this field, a study that was followed by several publications (Doron, 2010; Doron & Dayton, 2012; Dayton & Doron, 2012); with Prof. Nina Kohn, on connecting law and gerontology; and with Prof. Carole Cox, on a new and novel international index for the rights of older persons (IOPHRI). Finally, in the field of jurisprudential gerontology, I have received a grant from the Van Lear Institute to lead a research group in the field of ageism in Israel, and important research articles are in progress from this activity. This has led to the establishment of a COST action headed by Prof. Liat Ayalon in the field of ageism, which I headed Working Group 2 – on ageism and the law. This working groups resulted with a new book I am co-editing and *Law, Aging and Ageism in Europe* (with Nena Gerogantzi; Edward Elgar Publication). Thus, I was successful in deepening and focusing my research abilities and successful both in publishing in leading academic journals as well as winning significant research grants to promote my research, as I planned.

Moreover, since my last promotion I have established myself as an international lead-researcher in the field of Law, Social Policy and Ageing. This has been exemplified in my nomination to important commissions such as the ABA commission on Law and Aging, and IFA's Advisory Commission on Legal Issues. This has also been shown in my various books (e.g. with Prof. Helen Meenan) on the human rights perspectives of residential care. Finally, I was invited several times both by the UN and other international organizations (e.g. Age Europe) to be a member of various Expert Groups on elder rights, and writing recommendations for the Assembly General on the issue of the future of an International Convention for the Rights of Older Persons.

I would like to emphasize that, for better or for worse, my expertise covers a field that is unique in both its novel inter-disciplinary nature and its relationship to a relatively young discipline namely, Gerontology. The interdisciplinary nature of my field of expertise mandates linking legal knowledge to Gerontology and law. It requires being able to integrate the theory and methodology of disciplines that traditionally had no common ground. The



novelty of this field is that only very few scholars in the world have developed expertise in it, while there is great interest in it and a need to develop it.

### **B. Teaching and Academic Leadership**

In my teaching I place great emphasis on educating my students in both Gerontology and law. I strive to achieve excellence in teaching, and my efforts were rewarded by "Awards for Excellence in Teaching", in 2002 and 2003 and since then I continue to receive high scores on my teaching evaluations. Moreover, I use up-to-date technology in my teaching. All my courses are computerized and all my lectures to classes are accompanied by Power Point presentations. I have been nominated to be the Head of the Gerontology Department (between 2011 till 2016). During the period of my leadership I have established a new program within gerontology, in the field of financial gerontology. I have also supervised numerous Masters students, and various PhD students. Finally, I was involved in establishing a unique new course (with Dr. Maayan Agmon) on activism in old age, as part of the University's Flagship's program, which won various awards for novelty and social engagement.

### **C. Social Involvement and Contribution to the Community**

I am very actively involved in both the internal academic community and the external local and national social communities. Within academia I have initiated and have been involved in various projects, such as the establishment of a new and unique course on activism in old age, which involves older persons in the community who study along side students from the faculty of Welfare and Health Sciences.

Outside the academic community I am heavily involved, on a voluntary basis, in general community activity and in sharing my expertise with the older population in Israel. I was elected on 2009 to be the President of Israel's Gerontological Society (my term ended on 2013); I established a new NGO, Law in the Service of the Elderly ([www.elderlaw.org.il](http://www.elderlaw.org.il)), that is the first NGO of its kind in Israel that uses legal strategy to protect and promote the rights of older persons. As part of my activities in this NGO, I provide free legal information and advice to older persons. Furthermore, I give on a regular basis, lectures to older people in nursing homes, day centers, and old-age homes on a regular, voluntary basis.

Finally, it should be also mentioned that my academic work had some social impact through court decisions, (including the Israeli Supreme Court rulings) which either cited or relied on my published academic research, for example, in the field of grandparents visitation rights, or in the field of ageism.

### **D. Future plans**

I have many plans for the future. I will just mention the following three:

Firstly, as I have just won (with colleagues) a major project grant from the Minerva Foundation (for the next 5 years). I plan to invest a significant part of my time to establish this center and advance its international success;

Secondly, I have just established (with European colleagues) a new ELAN – European Law and Aging Network. As we just held the first founding meeting (in Lund, Sweden), I will work in the future to further develop this unique and novel European scholarly network, and advance in scientific standing and operation.

Finally, I am promoting international collaborations with gerontological institutes and academic institutions in the USA. In specific, I am working with UNO – the gerontological department of University of Nebraska Omaha (which a MOU – Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between UoH and MOU); and with UCSD – University of California San Diego, and its research institute of aging.
