K. Summary of my activities and future Plans

Summary of Research and Professional Experience and Interests

My academic research, publications and teaching are based on my original clinical expertise in occupational therapy which now approaches 34 years. This experience, now informed by a series of scientific studies, had led to research categorized into three major themes encompassing both theory and practical applications: (1) Environmental adaptations, accessibility and assistive technology as facilitators for participation; (2) Ergonomics and rehabilitation of diverse populations in educational and work settings; and (3) Participation of people in meaningful occupations. In all of these areas, I focus primarily on research related to the interaction between participation of people and the physical, technological and social aspects of their environments. In particular, I focus on the study of what make environments and services accessible for people with disabilities as well as for other vulnerable population (e.g., older adults, youth at risk, new immigrants). Below, I highlight my accomplishments including a summary of my unique contributions.

First, I would like to note my external funding of a range of multidisciplinary research since 2012, is more than one million dollars (~\$1,167,250 or, in Israeli currency, more than four million shekels ~NIS 4,085,365). I have been first principle investigator on these 12 grants and at least four of them are funding obtained two or more times from the same agency. These agencies include the Israeli National Insurance Institute, the Israeli Ministry of Science and Technology, Cancer Association and the Chicago-based MILGROM fund. The administration of the most recent five grants has entailed considerable managerial time and effort on my part given the cross-institutional and interdisciplinary composition of the research team. The focus is related to participation of various populations with disabilities to identify the barriers they face. The last year alone, I submitted four new proposals with various colleagues, of which two were funded and additional one approved for the second stage. In addition, my three doctoral students have completed their thesis and presented their work in few national and international conferences. A post-doc candidate (blind) from Columbia University, Vancouver Canada applied and received a scholarship from Azrieli fund for the year 2020-2021, but considers to postpone it due the COVID19 crisis.

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I have collaborated with a range of multidisciplinary teams, nationally and internationally, including occupational therapists, physicians, social workers, gerontologists, lawyers, sociologists, educators, architects and information processing experts. I honed this team approach during my post-doctoral fellowship in Syracuse, New York and my sabbatical leave at the Norwegian Social Research in Oslo, Norway and at the Faculty of Architecture and Town Planning, Technion Haifa, Israel. In 2019, I joined the Israeli National Knowledge and Research Center for Emergency Readiness consortium (http://muchanut.haifa.ac.il/index.php/en/), to contribute my viewpoint on future projects (one of them EU collaboration), mostly related to topics such as the accessibility of emergency services and ways to preserve participation of youth in social leisure activities during periods of emergency-related stress. In addition, the six countries International Consortium for Accessible Higher Education provided me with new contacts in the Department of Education at the University of Torino (Italy) and, more recently, at University of Cologne (Germany). The Transition to Employment project has also led to rich research collaborations with colleagues at the University of Chicago (Illinois). This research and the international conference we organized on the topic of employment of people with autism have resulted in additional collaborations with researchers from Australia and USA. These latter projects as well as study of students with disabilities have created interest in the analytical tools, we have developed amongst researchers worldwide.

Regarding my novel research methods, I use mixed methods that greatly add to our understanding of social phenomena and interactions with the environment. These are supplemented with advanced statistics (e.g. Structural Equation Models – SEM and PROCESS) evaluating environmental factors as mediators to participation) or RCT for evidence-based data to evaluate intervention outcomes, such as the study regarding using pressure gloves to reduce pain and improve hand function following wrist fractures (e.g. publication # a31). I have found beneficial to use comprehensive and precise qualitative methods with the aim of swaying policy makers to implement social changes. The mix with qualitative data helps to establish or improve research tools; and getting in-depth understanding of the data and to echo marginal populations (depending on the sequential or concurrent design choice). For example, my recently accepted publication (#35) describes the challenge for toilet training of toddlers with disabilities. The paradigm and results

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have been widely accepted by urologists who were in need of a practical, evidencebased tool for this population. I am pleased to report that this aspect of my work has been instrumental in developing and teaching qualitative research methods to graduate students and to attract them to use such tools in their thesis work. In addition, the collaboration with the urban planning has yielded also fruitful combination of subjective measures of perceived environmental barriers, together with Geographic Information System (GIS), (e.g. publication # c1), submitted recently as a collaborative proposal to the ISF.

In recognition for my major contributions to the development of the three themes nationwide (environmental adaptations, ergonomics and participation) of people in meaningful occupations, both academically and clinically, I was presented with the 2004 Annual Excellency Award from the Israeli Society of Occupational Therapists. Since then I have influenced policy and action in Israel (e.g. the computer to every child initiative, revolution in high education; transition to employment programs in high schools, school accessibility). Throughout this period I have being active in many roles in the Israeli Society of Occupational Therapy and other national professional committees and assumed a nominated position in the advisory board for the Ministry of Education. Nationally, I am known for my expertise and for involving and supervising many occupational therapists in various studies, both in Haifa and at other academic and clinical settings. In addition, stemming from my strong belief in identifying and providing opportunities, shortly after the legislation of the accessibility amendment, I have acquired one of the first licenses and established a national course for authorizing service accessibility experts for therapists, together with the Department of Architecture of Wizo Academic College, in Haifa.

It is my honor to work at the University of Haifa with its focus on multicultural diversity and co-existence and affording opportunities to those who live beyond the center of Israel. I bring this ideology to all of my action and research projects and in supervising and empowering occupational therapy students and graduates. For example, my study of the environment as facilitator or barrier for participation and involvement in occupations was implemented for adults with disabilities as perceived by four diverse groups: including those from Jewish, Arabic, new Russian immigrants, and adults with severe hearing impairment. My project on the current transition to employment, successfully applied in Jewish

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schools, has now been implemented, with full translation in Arabic speaking Druze schools as well as in the Education System in Chicago (Illinois). These days I launch a three years ergonomic project to empower the "transparent" group of cleaning staff at the University of Haifa, supported by "Manof" Israeli fund.

In addition I had the opportunity to serve (years 2016-2019) as the elected chair of the Department of Occupational Therapy in the Faculty of Social Welfare and Health Sciences at the University of Haifa, a joint program with the Technion (Haifa, Israel). Within this position I was in charge of four programs (PhD; M.A. & B.A), with culturally diverse students, where the graduate program includes two programs, one at an ultra-orthodox community Bnei-Brak.

My plans for the coming year are to devote the half sabbatical mostly for publishing the data gathered in the current projects, promoting international collaborations and manage the five active funded research projects I am responsible for. Recently, a candidate for post-doc (who is blind) from University of Columbia, Vancouver Canada has applied to Azrieli foundation to join our department next year to precede her research under my supervision, about transition of students with disabilities to employment.

Clinical expertise that opened academic and action opportunities:

My professional reputation has been recognized by few important committees that will likely lead to policy changes and cooperative research projects in the future: (1) Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor – accessibility of post-secondary professional courses; (2) The funds for developing services for people with disabilities – the Israeli National Insurance Institution; (3) Commission for Equality for People with Disability- Regulations for accessible high education; (4) Dorot-Eshel, JOINT, Jerusalem - Accessible Environments for the Elderly; (5) The Employee's Health committee – Ministry of Health.

It opened some opportunities for developing new action and research initiatives, for example: (1) establishing the professional founding of five "Karten Centers" around Israel, which evaluate and adapt computers and assistive technology (AT) for people with disability. I have trained and consulted many novice clinicians in providing AT. This allowed me to be involved in several follow up research projects that enabled me to establish and validate a model of outcome measures for AT adaptation (article # 10) that was recognized by Prof. M. Scherer a world-renowned researcher and theoretician in the AT field; (2) as an expert in ergonomics and rehabilitation in educational and work settings, I was invited by the Ministry of Industry, commerce & Labor to consult their professional education unit in regard to the accessibility of their courses. Since then I manage few projects regarding to transition to employment for various populations and was asked recently by the management of University of Haifa to write a grant proposal for an ergonomic prevention program among the cleaning workers at University of Haifa. In addition, I have been invited by the Israeli National Insurance to present in front their committee about considering adding a functional OT evaluation to the medical board that determines disability level.
