12. Miscellaneous

My academic career has developed in parallel with the development of other integral parts of my professional identity – being a clinical therapist, and a teacher/lecturer. Ever since my master studies I aimed to become more professional in the wide field of evidence-based practice, which I continually study and practice. I specialize in the treatment of people who deal with post-traumatic stress – a complex condition which affects the entire set of the bio-psycho-social systems. Therefore, I seek to master interventions that stem from varied approaches (cognitive, behavioral, experiential, mind-body, dynamic, individual, couple or group interventions, and more). In accordance – I am a certified CBT therapist and supervisor (Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy), a certified EMDR therapist (Eye-Movement and Desensitization Therapy), a certified CBCT therapist (Cognitive-Behavioral Conjoint Therapy), a certified PE therapist (Prolonged Exposure), a certified BioFeedback therapist, and a certified CPT therapist (Cognitive Processing Therapy). In addition, I have studied various other psychotherapies (for example Schema Therapy, DBT – Dialectical and Behavioral Therapy, Couple's EFT – Emotional Focusing Therapy).

As part of my service as a senior social worker at the mental health outpatient clinics of HaEmek Medical Center, I established, coordinated and led a therapeutic

community project, providing accessible psychotherapy for traumatized children and adolescents at their schools and kindergartens, in the years following the Second Lebanon War (2006-2008).

Additionally, I acted as the director of the mental health unit for IDF veterans at Ha'Emek mental health clinic for four years (2012-2016). As part of that work, I initiated and led an outdoors-therapy group for veterans coping with PTSD, for four years (2012-2016). Nowadays I continue to supervise the current staff members in the program.

As part of my work as a psychotherapist and a group therapist at the mental health clinics of Ha'Emek Medical Center, I also led a psychodynamic group therapy for young adults coping with diverse mental illnesses (personality disorders, schizophrenia and more) for 8 years (2008-2016).

I gained substantial relevant experience through studying and receiving close supervision from some of the most renowned therapists and researchers in the field of traumatic stress, in Israel (for example Prof. Muli Lahad, Prof. Rachel Dekel) and abroad (Prof. Edna Foa who developed the Prolonged Exposure protocol, and Prof. Candice Monson who developed the Cognitive Processing Therapy for PTSD, and more).

As I am involved in both research and clinical practice, I became a clinical instructor while continuously gaining more research experience. In 2018 I was invited to serve as a clinical consultant regarding the treatment of Bedouin / Muslim IDF veterans at 'BShvil HaMachar' organization, which specializes in Group Nature Assisted Interventions for traumatized IDF veterans. Since then, I have voluntarily served as a group clinical therapist, and head of research in this organization (https://www.bshvil.org/?lang=en). I initiated several studies in collaboration with academic partners (see items 11b above), in order to study and improve the field of intensive psychological interventions for veterans who deal with post-traumatic stress. These studies enhance the understanding of the mechanisms that work in psychotherapeutic interventions, as we turn not only to the veterans, but also to their spouses and parents. My dedication to this field is also manifested in the published works I took part in, whether as main author or as co-author.

As my research experience and publications evolved, so has my teaching career, which elaborated from teaching clinical workshops, to leading annual, clinical and research-oriented seminars, at various graduate studies programs. As a teacher/lecturer I am very enthusiastic about challenging my students to leave their comfort zone, both theoretically and in their therapeutic practice, in order to expand their knowledge, skills and professional confidence. I find teaching both challenging and rewarding, as it continuously demands my own personal development. Accordingly, my studies aim to find and formulate novel ways for dealing with post-traumatic stress, and to expand the traditional therapeutic conventions.

I. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans

My research and academic interests are in theoretical understanding of real-life coping, aiming to enhance potential therapeutic applications. Thus, I am continuously studying psychological therapeutic practices, while practicing clinical work.

I specialize in the field of trauma, and deal with sensitive issues related to the complexities of psychotherapy development, utilization and provision, for individuals

who faced military trauma, as well as various forms of civil traumatic events. Through my academic research I aim to deepen the understanding of the contextual, personal and interpersonal levels of such complicated circumstances. My Master Studies research dealt with the impact that an individual's mental injury (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder - PTSD) exerts on other family members, within a cross-cultural context. The aim of the study was to explore the interactions between the individual and his social environment, in order to better understand the inter-relations between trauma injury and social contexts. This study is presented in item 6a, and its findings were presented at a conference of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS - see item D1).

My doctoral dissertation aimed to enhance the understanding of PTSD as it is experienced and perceived among members of a non-Western cultural group, Bedouin veterans who suffer from PTSD. This work expanded the understanding of the subjective experience of PTSD in different cross-cultural contexts. I was familiarized with the Bedouin veteran population through my work as a therapist at HaEmek mental health services. My academic approach stemmed from an ecological view of research and therapy. Hence, I explored the conflictual and complex relations between participants' bio-psycho-social components, regarding their illness and possible therapeutic interventions, highlighting the notion of **Culture as a Doubled-Edged Sword**. This study is presented in two articles (items D2 & D7 above), and various derivatives of its findings were presented at a number of leading conferences in the field, in Israel and abroad (see tables 6 a, b & c above).

I continued exploring sensitive, conflictual post-traumatic conditions on my post-doctoral work, where I investigated the emotional experience and coping of remarried IDF widows, who had been dispossessed of their official recognition and widows' rights for decades. I took part in a collaboration between academics and field staff (a team of social workers from the Department of Commemoration and Families of the Ministry of Defense). I used my expertise in qualitative research, summarizing and conceptualizing the research findings and conclusions, as well as its theoretical and practical applications. This study is presented in three articles (items D4, D6 & D8 above), and its findings were presented at a number of international conferences (see items in table 6c, #5 & #8, above).

The interweave between trauma research and practice was accomplished also in my clinical fellowship position at a clinical laboratory at Ryerson University in Toronto, Canada, under the supervision of Professor Candice Monson, one of the world leaders in trauma research and treatment. During these two years, I studied and practiced focused couple therapy for trauma victims and their spouses, and focused cognitive therapy for trauma victims. I took part in an international research team (Canadian and Israeli researchers), studying the possibilities of applying Trauma-Focused therapeutic protocols developed in one culture, to another cultural environment. The findings of this study were published - see item D5 above.

I have been practicing clinical social work in both the public service and at a private clinic for the past 15 years, and I continuously expand my work via theoretical and clinical research. For example, I established and promoted unique nature-based group therapy for trauma survivors dealing with chronic PTSD. This treatment takes place in nature, in an unconventional context for patients and therapists alike, and promotes unique strengths in an interpersonal / group interaction. This project was accompanied by research that I conducted, focusing on this unique form of group therapy. This study's findings were presented at international conferences in Israel and abroad (see table A6, items # 2, 5, & 8 above), and are about to be published (chapter D above, Revised & Resubmitted articles).

My current research centers on the implications and effects of therapeutic group journeys for IDF veterans dealing with longitudinal aspects of exposure to traumatic events (clinical and subclinical/subthreshold PTSD). I continue to expand my therapeutic expertise, combining several therapeutic approaches (individual traumafocused therapy, group therapy, and nature-assisted-therapy), while studying the effects and efficacy of this multi-dimensional approach. I am leading a research team in BShvil HaMachar (a non-profit organization specializing in such therapeutic journeys), where I have initiated several studies, evaluating the impact of outdoors and interpersonal clinical interventions. My research is focused on the ecological understanding of trauma and its aftermath, working in collaboration with several academics who study various levels of these phenomena. I currently co-supervise MA students at the University of Haifa and at Achva Academic College, and a Ph.D. student at the university of Haifa (see table 11b above).

My future research plans are to keep developing and expanding these studies, from the biological level (e.g., a collaboration with the Center for Hyperbaric Medicine and Research at Shamir Medical Center), through the personal level, to the social policy levels. I wish to conceptualize a broad understanding of the effects of trauma through research work that will focus on the longitudinal expressions of both clinical and subthreshold military-related post-traumatic stress.

In addition, I have a special interest in teaching, and enjoy consulting and mentoring healthcare practitioners in their professional development. I have supervised numerous clinicians in the field of cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT), and taught various courses in several academic programs. I intend to expand this aspect of my work, as I wish to provide an annual CBT seminar, where the participants will implement CBT interventions within individual therapies, and present their work as a cohort for qualitative/quantitative research, or as case studies. I believe that my diverse experience and academic research knowledge could make this a meaningful learning experience.

My contribution as a researcher and lecturer to the School of Social Work will stem from my diverse research experience, based upon many years of therapeutic practice and rich and varied clinical experience, working with both children and adults. My goal is to enhance the connection between research, academic teaching, and therapeutic practice – all disciplines in which I have proven abilities. I maintain strong research and teaching relationships with people and organizations from the field of therapy, in treatment and research centers in Israel and abroad. I intend to expand my clinical research in collaboration with these partners.

As part of my future contribution to the school I will seek to teach theoretical and clinical courses in the field of mental health and trauma care. My being a licensed clinical instructor in the Israeli Association for Behavioral-Cognitive Therapy, having extensive experience in mentoring trainees in the field, will enhance and promote teaching of focused evidence-based therapeutic interventions. I believe that my mentoring of young professionals venturing into the world of therapeutic practice will contribute substantially to their future professionalism.
